

Music Street Finds the Rhythm to Win

On Thursday at The Prince George's Equestrian Center adult amateur riders kept the outdoor ring to themselves and enjoyed the October sunshine. Three sections showcased some of the most talented 3' hunters in the country, but it was Lindsey Evans-Thomas of Annapolis, MD, and the lovely Music Street who found the jumps consistently enough to be pinned center ring with the tricolor in the Adult Amateur 36-50 division, as well as the Grand Champion, the Leading Rider award and the EMO Trip of the Show.

"He is the Cadillac of horses," said Evans-Thomas smiling after their win. "He is a lovely, lovely animal. He's got an amazing attitude and floats across the ground."

Evans-Thomas showed him for the first time two weeks ago at the Middleburg Classic where she picked up the reserve champion. Evans-Thomas explained how she was lucky enough to get the ride on the Weisman's Music Street saying, "Krista couldn't show him at Middleburg because she had to go to a wedding so they asked me if I wanted to show him. The Weismans graciously lent him to me for this show, and specifically the Challenge Class (on Friday)."

Although she juggles two young boys and a career making commercials, Evans-Thomas gets out a few times during the week to ride. Due to a busy work schedule, however, Capital Challenge was only her fourth show of 2010. Evans-Thomas said of her win, "I feel at this level of competition if you just get a ribbon you're doing really well. It truly is a magnificent horse show."

In the Adult Amateur 51 & over division Laure Lee Montross picked up the tricolor with her Wind Dancer. In the 18-35 division Cara Cheska stepped out of a hectic week to walk into the ring on Thursday morning, set it all aside, and pick up the championship ribbon with Joy Harrington-Graue's Tucker.


"I was able to block it out for the couple of minutes that I was in the ring," said Cheska, who had to fit in a wedding, her daughter's fifth birthday party, WEG and all the traveling in between. "I haven't catch rode since I was junior. I put so much pressure on myself. (Nora and Morgan Thomas) don't put any pressure on me. They are the nicest people to ride for. I'm just glad that I did my job and that it ended up well."

"I've never done this show before, and they do a fantastic job. I love all of the presentations and awards. I've heard about it and everyone says you should do it, and now I know why." *****

Lumiere and Jane Gaston Light the Way to the Grand

Jane Gaston of The Plains, VA, and her horse Lumiere lit up the Show Place arena with top ribbons in the \$9,000 Amateur-Owner 36 & Over Hunters, sponsored by The Hallman Family and MerryLegs South. Their championship came from two firsts and two seconds over fences in the division. Ellen Toon and Invincible were the reserve champions.

Thanks to their top ribbons, Gaston and Lumiere were named the Grand Amateur-Owner Hunter Champions, which was sponsored by Mr. and Mrs. Will Roberts, and were awarded the Dr. Harold M.S. Smith Trophy, donated by Dr. Suzanne Smith and Dr. Peter Craig. Gaston was named the Best Amateur-Owner Rider, an award sponsored by Mr. and Mrs. Ernest M. Oare. She received the So Many Ways Challenge Trophy, donated by Karen Kramer.

Gaston and Lumiere also won the \$2,500 WCHR Amateur-Owner 3'6" Challenge. (see page 7 for story).

Gaston has owned Lumiere, a nine-year-old Oldenburg gelding, for five years. "He's part of our family now," she said. "He's just progressed from Baby Green and Pre-Green all the way up to being an old guy now."

Gaston has had a very successful year with both Lumiere and Listen. About Lumiere, she said, "He's been a real trooper all year long. He's consistent, he'll do the same thing for you every day. You know what he is. He's just a solid citizen."

This is Gaston's first championship at Capital Challenge. She showed Lumiere here last year as a Second Year Green Working Hunter. "He got ribbons, but he was green," she remembered. "He's come back this year and was like, 'I know this place.' He's very sure of himself now."

"It feels great to be at the top of the heap," she went on to say. "There are so many nice horses. I love mine, but if I had to have about ten of the others, I'd be just fine! They're just wonderful animals and just high-quality. It's great people to compete against too. I try to go

ity. It's great people to compete against too. I try to go one day at a time. These horses are so good that I just try to stay out of their way. At the end of the day, it feels super to win here." Champion in the \$9,000 Amateur-Owner 18-35 Hunters, sponsored by Mr. and Mrs. Ernest M. Oare, was Sunny Moon, ridden and owned by Jaime Auletto of Blackwood, NJ. They won two over fences classes (including the final handy stake class) and placed fifth for the top tricolor. Auletto has owned Sunny Moon, an eight-year-old Hanoverian mare, for almost two years. They showed sparingly in the Adult Hunters before moving up to the 3'6" division. When Auletto rode in the Small Pony Hunters, she finished as reserve champion, but hasn't been in the championship presentations since then. She laughed, "It's been awhile! I've done this for a long time, but these shows are still special. I still get excited to show. It's nice to come and do well. I'm very lucky to have two nice young horses." The \$6,500 Amateur-Owner 3'3" Hunter division is a new addition to the Capital Challenge and is sponsored by Bruce Duchossois/HnD Stables, Inc., Woodland Way, Inc., and Wood Run Farm/The Tredennick Family. The championship went to Showtime, ridden by Veronica Miller of Wildwood, MO. Miller said that emotions were swirling when she found out that she was the champion. "I came here and said all I wanted was to win one class. I just wanted somebody to put that medal around my head. We were laughing because I've still never won a class! But I was consistent," she said with a smile. "It's like a dream come true. I was almost crying before I walked in there. I

told Kendra (Schultz), 'We're walking slow. It's like getting married. You only walk down this aisle once.' It's unbelievable."



U.S. Hunter Jumper Association Seeks Amateur Sportsmanship Nominees

Do you know of an amateur who exhibits excellence and integrity by supporting fellow competitors and volunteering their resources to the industry? If so, it's time to nominate him or her for the U.S. Hunter Jumper Association Amateur Sportsmanship Award.

In its fifth year, the award was created by the USHJA Amateur Committee to honor an amateur for contributions to the sport. Past winners include Christina Jones, Peggy O'Meara, Parker Minchin and Patricia Van Housen. "While amateurs are very dedicated to horse showing,

"While amateurs are very dedicated to horse showing, they're also committed to giving back to the industry. We wanted to find a way to recognize the amateurs who go above and beyond," said Betty Oare, vice-chairman of the USHJA Amateur Committee.

The award—which will be presented at the Evening of Equestrians Awards Dinner during the USHJA Annual Meeting, Dec. 6-9 in San Antonio, Texas—is about the bigger picture. The sportsmanship winners all demonstrate a genuine love of the horse, help fellow competitors, give back to the sport by volunteering to sit on committees or assisting at shows, and are generous with their time. Success in the show ring is a secondary factor.

Nominations for the award may come from exhibitors, trainers, colleagues, peers or even amateurs themselves. The nominee must be an active or associate member of the USHJA. A completed application must be submitted, and a letter of recommendation is highly recommended. Please submit nominations to the USHJA office by Oct. 18. The members of the USHJA Amateur Committee will review the nominations and select the winner.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP HUNTER RIDER AWARDS

Gaston and Lumiere Light Up the Ring in the WCHR 3'6" A/O Challenge

Sea Walker jumps to the top of the WCHR 3'3" Amateur-Owner Challenge by 'I When Jane Gaston entered the ring for know I can always count on him."

When Jane Gaston entered the ring for the \$2,500 WCHR 3'6" Amateur-Owner Challenge, much more than the blue ribbon in the class was at stake. The WCHR Amateur-Owner

National Championship title was on the line.

So when Gaston and Lumiere posted a score of 88 and clinched the victory today at the Capital Challenge Horse Show, she also left the Prince George's Equestrian Center with the national championship.

"I knew we were behind in points. I knew it was doable," said Gaston. "Yet, I knew this was just a class to get through. So that's how we rode it: just go do this class."

Melissa Doddridge, Tustin, CA, and Best Man earned the reserve national title with her third-placed finish in the WCHR 3'6" Amateur-Owner Challenge, while Tracy Scheriff Muser, Wellington, FL, placed third in the national standings with her red-ribbon finish in the Challenge.

Gaston, 60, The Plains, VA, had never previously competed in the

WCHR Amateur-Owner Challenge, so the win was especially gratifying, as was their banner week at the show where Lumiere earned the Amateur-Owner, 36 and over, and Grand Amateur-Owner Championships. (see story page 3) In addition, Gaston's Listen earned the show's Grand Hunter and Grand Conformation titles and the Green Conformation Hunter championship with professional Kelley Farmer in the irons.

After Lumiere, a 9-year-old Oldenburg, clinched the division championship, Gaston went into the WCHR Amateur-Owner Challenge with a plan to ride her best and see where the chips would fall.

"I just went in there knowing I had a little bit of a tired horse. And so I thought, 'Don't do anything stupid,' " she said. "Today he did everything I asked of him. That's one great thing about him—he's always cheerful. He always goes around with his ears up and doing his job. I

Gaston, who has trained with Larry Glefke for 1 ½ years, said this year's results have been more than she ever expected.

"I've never competed in this class before," she said of

the WCHR Challenge. "Winning this is pretty cool. Yes, it [the WCHR] has been a goal. It's really been a magical year. You don't come here and think that both horses are going to be champion and grand champion. They've been super."

Nicole Oliynyk, 37, Franklin, MA, also had a super day. In the \$2,500 WCHR 3'3" Amateur-Owner Challenge, Oliynyk's accurate and flowing trip aboard Sea Walker clinched the win with 88.33 points. "I've never won a class here, so this means a lot to me," she said. "I did the Ariat [Medal Finals] years ago and different things and always did well, thirds and fifths. But it's really nice to have a big win like this."

Oliynyk has been partnered with her 10-year-old Canadian Thoroughbred for three years. After a successful stint in the adult amateur division, where they

earned the 2009 USHJA Zone 1 championship, Oliynyk moved up to the 3'3" division this year.

"This division is a lot of fun," she said. "I like it a lot. I don't get as nervous as I do with the bigger jumps. You can just ride and have fun. And you still have the handy round, which I love."

Nicole trains with her husband David and balances her passion for riding and competing with her career in the biotech industry. "I ride on the weekends, and I try to escape the office early on Fridays to ride. This is my getaway, and I love it."

Cathy Morris-Schmitt, Greenwood Village, CO, was awarded the WCHR 3'3" Amateur-Owner National Championship today and was accompanied to the ring by her trainer, Joie Gatlin.
